Thank you very much for your email and for your kind concern. I am happy to inform you that all the scholarship students and my family are in good health.

Unfortunately, I have not been able to contact Mr. Santa Ram or Mr. Nurnidhi Neupane. It has been quite a long time since we last met or communicated with each other.

I believe that the Matsumoto Himalaya Friendship Club, Kathmandu Chapter, is no longer active. I do not have any recent information about the organization or its activities.

Finally, I was able to contact Mr. Abash Pokharel, the son of Mr. Santa Ram. I asked him to inform his father and request that he write to you, as I know you are very concerned about him.

Regarding the recent flood disaster, search and rescue activities around the hydropower plants are still continuing. On September 16, the rescue team recovered an additional four bodies from the tunnel of the Chilime Hydropower Plant.

According to the latest information as of September 17:

Bodies recovered: 1,403

People still missing: 6,150

The flood also affected the highway to Pokhara near Mugling and Krishnabhir, causing major disruption and blocking access along the route. The Nepal Army, Nepal Police, and local government authorities worked together and successfully opened an alternative route. Vehicles are now able to pass through the highway again.

There was also a shortage of cooking gas and fuel because of the road blockage. However, the situation is gradually returning to normal.
